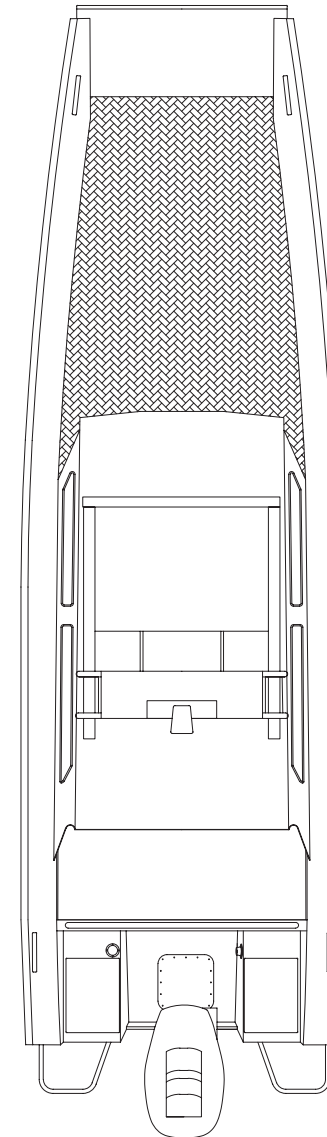


# ALUKIN CW 750

The ALUKIN CW 750 is a fully welded work-boat in aluminium with a loading ramp (for easy loading). This is the boat that is equally well suited when there's work to be done as it is for the active leisure user with many projects on the go. The foredeck is optimised for load capacity, and the loading ramp at the front of the boat makes it easy to load and unload everything from building materials to ATVs and lawnmowers. The ramp can be easily manoeuvred via a keypad from the driver's seat and is controlled by an electric winch. The foredeck is no less than 2.5 metres in length, and the opening onto the deck is 1.28 metres wide. The standing room inside the cabin is 190 cm. As with all Alukin boats, the CW 750 has a fully welded hull for optimum strength, with the cabin and hull welded as a single unit, and is built in aluminium throughout with a design and construction that can

cope with the toughest of conditions. It is also equipped with Alukin's soundproofing concept, developed to deliver first-class comfort.

The spacious cabin is designed to provide the best possible visibility, with a wide sun-roof and full-size doors in the front and aft for ease of entry and exit. The secure after-deck makes it easy to moor the boat from on board and is large enough to accommodate some of the cargo while still providing ample room to enjoy a spot of fishing. This model has a wide side deck in anti-slip sheet metal with sturdy grab rails, making it easy to move around the boat, even on the outside. There are a number of optional extras available, such as a refrigerator box, food warming cabinet and kitchenette with a sink and cooking facilities.
